Terms

Migrant

- 1. A person who moves regularly in order to find work
- A person who leaves one 2. country to settle permanently in another; an immigrant



Migrate

To move from one country, place, or locality to another

Immigrate: To migrate INTO a country or

territory

Emmigrate: To migrate OUT OF a country or territory

Multiculturalism

When cultures, races, and ethnicities embrace their differences to be appreciated within a dominant culture

Documented **Immigrant**

"legal immigrant" or alien - owing political allegiance to another country or government; foreign

Undocumented Immigrant

often called "illegal immigrant," an informal, casual, colloquial term often considered offensive
